Uniform System of Assessment - VI-VIII

The C B S E has issued the restoration of Board Examination and revised assessment structure from Academic year 2017-18 onwards.

This new scheme will bring uniformity in the system of assessment and examination for classes IX and X in all the CBSE affiliated schools. To increase confidence in the students to start preparing for class X Board examination when they join the upper primary stage in class VI, the CBSE has decided to implement the uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and issue of report cards for classes VI to VIII also on the similar pattern. The scheme for classes VI-VIII has been designed on Term Assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X Board examination, and would thus, ensure the 'quality of education'.



Scholastic Area: The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2 as explained below:

5. Co-Scholastic Activities (Classes VI-VIII): For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following area to be carried out in CBSE affiliated schools by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities.

2. Co-Scholastic Activities:

Schools should promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the student. These activities will be graded on a 5-point grading scale (A to E) and will have no descriptive indicators. No upscaling of grades will be done.

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values):

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps to build character, sincerity, good behaviour and values develop strength and foster unity and cooperation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a Five-point scale (A to E). The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and a structured approach. For a holistic assessment, the teachers are expected to make it an effective tool.

B. Documentation:

Records pertaining to the internal assessment of the students done by the schools will be maintained for a period of three months from the date of declaration of result for verification at the discretion of the Board. Subjudiced cases, if any or those involving RTI/ Grievances may however be retained beyond three months

C. Assessment Scheme of Class-VI to IX in the CBSE affiliated schools:

The CBSE affiliated schools, for -the purpose of uniformity in classes VI to IX may replicate the same assessment model as described above for Class-X for Academic year 2017-18.
